

Application to become a CPE Judge

You must be a CPE member in good standing to apply to become a CPE Judge. A prospective judge, who has never judged in another agility venue, must have completed through at least the four category titles in level 4 (in at least one or more height categories) with at least one dog. Judges, who are approved to judge in another agility venue, will be reviewed on an individual basis, if they do not have the above required CPE titles.

Supervision will be required before acquiring full Judge's privileges. Judge's privileges may be revoked at any time with just cause.

In an effort to help you with this, we ask that you inform the Judge of record at a trial that you are applying to become an apprentice judge and ask them to review your course building abilities and sign your application showing that you have worked with them at a trial in a course building capacity.

Please discuss this with the judge at the beginning of the trial. It is mandatory to have at least one line filled out, however, it is required to have additional experience in course building before being approved as an apprentice.

Application process: <ul style="list-style-type: none">➤ Complete and send in this application – NOTE: Assignments cannot be accepted nor can an apprenticeship approval date be anticipated➤ The CPE judge’s application liaison will forward to you the requirements for the written test and design test (Clean Run Course Designer is required for the design test, see www.cleanrun.com)➤ Completed Test Courses must be returned in a zip file to the persons listed on page one, within 4 months of your judge’s application date, or you will be required to reapply➤ Test courses will be reviewed and comments returned. Required revisions, if any, must be returned within 30 days Once the application, test and design work have been satisfactorily completed you will be assigned Apprentice Judge status.
Apprentice Judging process: <ul style="list-style-type: none">➤ Upon approval from CPE, you may accept assignments from CPE host clubs. You must notify the host club, prior to signing a contract, that you are an apprentice judge, so they may secure a supervising judge or obtain a non-apprentice judge in your place.➤ An apprentice judge must be supervised by at least 3 different CPE supervising judges, for at least 3 different trials (a trial is one or more consecutive days). Some judges may require more supervision.<ul style="list-style-type: none">◆ Your supervising judge will submit a report upon completion of the assignment.➤ You must attend a CPE judge’s clinic within 1 year of your apprenticeship being approved.
NOTE: During your apprenticeship, Judging fees will be split 50/50 between the apprentice judge and supervising judge.
