

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

* The safety of the dogs is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all obstacles safely.

* Entry fees will not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by action of the show committee.

* It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dog(s) and / or children. Any exhibitor whose dog(s) and / or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the show committee, be asked to leave the show site. In that case, no refund of any fees paid will be made.

* No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee.

* Exhibitors are responsible for complete, accurate, and legible information on the entry forms: illegible or incomplete entries cannot be entered in the show. Returned checks will not be considered a valid entry fee, and there will be a \$30. charge for returned checks.

From I-91 – Take exit 10 (rt 40) to end. Right onto Rt 10 (Whitney Ave) approx 1 mi. to left onto Sherman Ave at Dunkin Donuts. 8/10 mi to right onto Corporate Ridge. Bldg to left at top of hill

Rt 15 south – Take exit 62 (Whitney Ave. north). Right onto Whitney Ave and follow as above.

Rt 15 north – Exit 60 (Dixwell Ave) Left onto Dixwell, then left onto Rt 10 north. Go 2.1 mi to Sherman Ave and follow as above.

The following order is the scheduled order for the trial to be run. If the order needs to be changed for the trial due to extreme pre-trial circumstances, it will be posted in the confirmation letter sent to all entered exhibitors at least 7 days before the first trial day. The order will only be changed at the trial in the case of an extreme reason and must be agreed upon by the host club and judge(s).

REFUNDS: Withdrawals after the closing date due to injury of the dog, or for bitches who come in heat will be eligible for 75% refund of entry fee paid upon receipt of a note from your veterinarian.

PRIZES & AWARDS: Placement ribbons will be awarded for 1st through 4th place for Qualifying and non-qualifying scores for all classes. Dogs with an NT (no time) are not eligible for any ribbons. Qualifying ribbons will be awarded to all dogs receiving a qualifying score, and Jr Handlers in Standard.

EXERCISE YOUR DOG RESPONSIBLY! PLEASE PICK UP AFTER YOUR DOG AT THE SHOW SITE AND HOTELS! ALL DOGS MUST BE ON LEASH EXCEPT WHEN IN THE RING OR WARM UP AREA. THERE IS A LEASH LAW IN THE TRIAL SITE'S STATE. No prong or electric collars allowed on site.

OBSTACLES: The following obstacles may be used. Obstacle specifications shall meet the current CPE obstacle requirements

A-frame – 9' sides, rubber granules, slats	Dog Walk – 12' planks, rubber granules, slats
Teeter – 12' plank, rubber granules, slatless	Weave poles – 24" poles - center to center
Jumps: Bar, Spread, Panel	Open Tunnels

MOVE-UPS: Pre-trial move-ups accepted until noon Monday, July 24. Move-ups from Standard, and Wildcard on Saturday must be submitted to secretary before the end of Sat. classes. No move-ups will be done on the day the class is being run.

BRIEFING and STARTING TIMES: There will be a live morning briefing at 7:30 AM, followed by walk-thrus for the first course. First dog on the line at 8 AM. Exhibitors will be responsible for knowing terms and conditions set forth in these briefings.

Maps will be e-mailed to all exhibitors the evening before each day of the trial, and will include a judge's briefing for each class. A copy of each sheet of course maps will also be posted at the trial, if you prefer to take a photo of that. There will be a few paper copies of maps available for those unable to download or print the e-mailed copies.

PARKING: Unloading is permitted near the entrance to the crating building. Overnight RV is not permitted at the site, per zoning regulations. Handicapped spaces are available on a first come, first served basis. If you need Handicapped parking, please plan to arrive early.

CRATING: Crating space will be available in a separate temperature-controlled building near-by. Crating spaces may be limited - working out of your vehicle is encouraged.

DECLARED TRAINING IN THE RING: SCAT does allow training in the ring. See page four of this premium or CPE On-Line Rule Book – pages 15-16.

FOOD: Due to covid-19 precautions, no food or drinks will be provided. Please bring your own. Also, there will be no access to refrigerator, microwave, stove etc. in the kitchen. Light snacks will be available for volunteers.

Job Descriptions

Scribe: The scribe marks the faults or points as directed by the judge. You must be able to pay full attention to the judge and not the dog during a run.

Timer: Electronic timing will be used. Timer tells the team when to “go” and starts/stops the timer or monitors that timer has automatically started/stopped (depending on class).

Gate Steward: Ensures dogs and handlers are ready at the start line and helps the scribe and/or assistant scribe match the running order on the gate steward sheets.

Ring Crew: Resets jump bars for height changes and when knocked down; also straightens tunnels. This job usually allows you to sit down and watch the dogs run.

Runner: Takes the scribe sheet from the scribe and gives it to the score table and/or moves the leash from the start line to the finish line. A great job for the new exhibitor as it allows you to watch the dogs run while you work. May require substantial walking.

Course Builder: Moves obstacles as directed by the judge and/or chief course builder. This is a great way to learn how to set a course.

Jump Heights – no dog will jump lower than 4”

P-Card = Permanent Card: the lowest allowable Regular height a dog may jump in CPE.

General CPE rules for entries/show site:

- Dogs must be at least 15 months or older the first day of the trial
- Blind (both eyes), lame, in season or aggressive dogs may not enter the show. The Club may choose to exclude any of the above from the site.
- Dogs must be registered with CPE prior to the closing date of the trial, or by the trial date for Day Of Show entries. Registration forms are on the Forms page: www.k9cpe.com. Forms MUST be mailed to CPE and are processed 2-3 times per week. CPE ID numbers are emailed to legible email addresses. Registrations can only be processed from mailed forms.
- Dogs must be able to be measured at their first show. If a dog cannot be measured, the dog cannot run and no refund will be issued. Dogs within ½” of a jump height require at least one more measurement. When dogs reach their second birthday, a measurement is required. All dogs must be measured at their first trial regardless of jump height.
- Only CPE Judges can measure dogs.
- Electronic shock collars are not allowed at ANY CPE trial – training or bark.
- Handlers in all classes are permitted to walk the course, without a dog, prior to the start of the class. A warm-up jump shall be provided for all entered dogs. No relieving of dogs in the warm-up area.

Dogs in the ring, leashes, exiting the ring

- Dogs may now run in CPE with one flat buckle collar. If dog is wearing a tick/flea collar, that is permitted, but they may only be wearing one collar without anything attached to it. They may have a small barrette or rubber band to keep hair out of a dog’s eyes. They may not have clothing, stitches, wraps or any other item. This is for the safety of the dog.
- Leashes may not have anything (other than name/license tags) attached to them when used in the ring.
- Dogs may enter the ring on a collar, quick release harness or head halti/leader. If prong collars are allowed per the show site, they may *not* be used to take a dog into the ring.

- Handlers may carry their leash with them in their pocket on the course – or they may drop it near the start line for the leash runner to carry to the finish.
- Dogs must be under the handler’s control when leaving the ring or the judge may enter the run as No Time - NT.

For clubs that will allow Declared Training in the Ring

SCAT will offer Declared training in the ring. The handler has the option if they want to use a toy or training aid at any time during their run, the handler must approach the Judge during Walkthrough or previously in that trial day for the Judge to approve the toy or training aid for use on the course.

- Handler must alert the Judge upon entry to the ring that the dog will be TIR. Handler is then allowed to have a reasonably sized silent toy/aid with them for use once their run has started (this toy must be approved by the Judge of record PRIOR to the start of the class to determine its eligibility, absolutely no food/scents/audible devices). The toy is NOT allowed to be used in either gate chute or prior to the previous dog leaving the ring.

See the online rulebook or current member letter for additional rules.

The following items are considered training in the ring (see Fix and Go):

- Violating the 4 paw safety rule (directing the dog back onto the contact)
- Start line stay – leaving the dog and going back again to reposition the dog after the handler passes the plane of the first obstacle (before the handler leaves the dog, repositioning or repeated commands can be a delay of start)
- Putting the dog back on the table in the point games

While running on course (see exceptions for “Training in the ring”)

- The handler will direct the dog through the course without a lead.
- Food, toys, training devices (includes fanny packs and leash attachments) are not allowed within 10’ feet of the ring. Clickers, training whistles and squeaky toys are not to be used within distraction distance of the ring.
- The handler may not carry anything that could aid the dog in its performance. Exclusion: Handicapped/Differently Abled Handlers using a cane, scooter, wheelchair, etc., to enable their progression around the course.

The handler may use any verbal or visual commands to direct the dog through the course. The Judge may assess a 5 fault penalty to elimination for any command that is not given in a sportsmanlike manner. Faults can be but are not limited to: foul or abusive language, display of anger, extreme frustration or excessive harshness. If the fault is severe enough, the Judge has the right to excuse the exhibitor from the ring and / or the remainder of the trial. If excused from the trial, a report would be filed with CPE. See Faults, Eliminations and Excusals in the rulebook.
